# To consider the involvement of the Civic Centre in the Walkers recycling scheme with Terracycle.

#### 1.0. Summary

1.1. The report sets out details of a Walkers Crisp recycling scheme with TerraCycle.

### 2.0. The Scheme

- 2.1. The scheme offers a recycling programme funded by brands, manufacturers, and retailers around the world to help collect and recycle hard-to-recycle waste.
- 2.2. Their Zero Waste Box developed by TerraCycle provides a comprehensive recycling solution for everyday consumer waste. There are over 100 different boxes to choose from and a resident has suggested that the Council could provide a re-cycling box at the Civic Centre for discarded crisps packets and bags.
- 2.3. Once collected, the crisp packets are separated by plastic type, cleaned, and extruded into plastic pellets to make new recycled products.
- 2.4. To set up the scheme the Council would have to purchase a recycling box, which when full would be sent or picked up free of charge. A new box would have to be purchase each time.

The cost of the boxes are as follows:

Small / 25x25x46cm / approx.	702 units of waste - £124.72
Medium / 30.5x30.5x84cm / approx.	1907 units of waste - £164.84
Large / 38x38x100cm / approx.	3525 units of waste - £230.26

No budget has been set aside for the cost of such a scheme.

- 2.5. The scheme can also earn reward points which means the Council could help raise money for local good causes. This would have to be donated to a non-profit organisation or school or its choice.

This year Active Uckfield has partnered up with Wealden District Council to run an activity day for all ages. It will focus on four key areas – nutrition, community, physical activity and mental wellbeing.

Previously the Active Uckfield taster days had predominantly focused on physical activity, but working with Wealden District Council and their background in holding summer activity days, it was planned to bring the two events together and create a great Saturday day out for all ages and all members of the family, with activities both educational and fun.

A plan of communication was drawn up to widely promote the event and discussions took place on potential groups and organisations to involve.
