HOLY CROSS CHRISTMAS TREE

Uckfield Town Council sponsors the Holy Cross Church Annual Festival of Christmas Trees by lighting the large Christmas tree in the churchyard. This is the eleventh year the festival has been running and it will be taking place on Friday 7, Saturday 8 and Sunday 9 December.

Last year the festival attracted over 6,300 visitors. There were 98 displays which had been sponsored by a cross section of Uckfield's community including schools, businesses, voluntary organisations, community support groups as well as individuals and families.

This year's festival is set to be equally as special and will feature a Civic Centre tree depicting the fairy tale Jack and the Beanstalk, our feature pantomime this year.

SETTING OUR DRAFT PRIORITIES AND BUDGET FOR 2019/20

External Auditor's Report 2017/18

Members were pleased to receive the external auditor's report for the financial year ending 31 March 2018, which reported sound financial and governance procedures.

Grass verge cutting 2019/20

Members were recently faced with a challenging decision on whether they should provide a financial contribution towards grass verge cutting. In 2018, the number of grass verge cuts, funded by East Sussex County Council, were reduced from five/six to two cuts per annum within the urban verge areas. Despite much debate, and a very close vote, the Town Council agreed to pay for four additional urban grass cuts in 2019/20 to enhance the existing

service by the County Council. This would cost the Town Council in the region of £6009 with the service being carried out by the County Council's contractors.

Setting our priorities and budget for 2019/20

The December meeting of Full Council will see members review the first draft of the priorities and budget papers for 2019/20. These papers will be placed on the Town Council's website following the meeting until Friday 4 January 2019. We would welcome your thoughts on the draft documents and proposed initiatives for the next financial year, before the budget is finalised at Full Council on 14 January 2019 and, the precept agreed.
