LAST MONTH IN YOUR COUNCIL

Formalising parking controls in Uckfield High Street

The highway improvements undertaken in 2016, introduced new parking and waiting restrictions in Uckfield High Street. A period of time was given to



enable the changes to settle in and for highway engineers to monitor traffic flow but now East Sussex Highways are seeking to formalise the proposed changes to the parking bays by carrying out a formal six-month consultation on the experimental traffic order. The deadline for representations and comments is 17 November 2019 so there's still time! Looking into Public Space Protection Orders

At the August meeting of Full Council, members were provided with initial information about Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs). These powers were introduced via the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. This legislation introduced a number of new tools and powers for the Police and partner agencies to address anti-social behaviour.

PSPOs can be used to prohibit specific activities and/or require certain things to be done within a defined public area. To meet the criteria, these activities have to have a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality and be of a persistent or continuing nature.

These orders can take one to two years to put in place, so the Town Council will look to meet with both Sussex Police and Wealden District Council, to see if such powers would be beneficial in Uckfield.
