UCKFIELD REVIVAL – SATURDAY 7TH OCTOBER 2017

Over a year ago we were eagerly awaiting the reinstatement of two-way traffic flow returning to our High Street. To mark the occasion we held a parade of classic, historic and interesting vehicles driving both ways in the High Street, which were then shown on Luxford Field.

This proved to be very popular and it was suggested we repeat the event.



So this year on Saturday 7th October 2017 we will commence with the vehicles assembling at the Highlands Inn at 10.00am for refreshments. They will then proceed through the town and up the High Street before parking in Luxford Field for an interesting display.

We do hope you will enjoy the show and that the weather stays kind to present these vehicles in their full splendour!



LAST MONTH IN YOUR COUNCIL

A public exhibition was held at the beginning of July for residents near to Hughes Way Play area to view the proposed designs from six companies. The Environment and Leisure Committee reviewed the feedback received from the public at their meeting in July. Members felt the design by HAGS-SMP was the most impressive and met the needs of the residents and community. An update would now be circulated to residents in the neighbouring roads, and contact made with the play area company to start planning the finer details of the installation and proposed timescales for the works to take place.

The Road Safety Working Group were commended on the fantastic day organised in June which saw pupils from 11 primary schools take part in an interactive day with agencies such as East Sussex Highways, Southern Rail and East Fire & Rescue to learn about safety on our roads. The date has been set for next year as 20th June 2018 and contact will be made with schools in the next few weeks.

At Full Council, members received an update on the progress being made towards the Town Council's annual priorities for 2017-18. They also reviewed Wealden District Council's draft Housing Strategy 2017-20 which they agreed was well written; it highlights the current circumstances affecting

housing supply and demand in Wealden District. Members raised their concerns however, on the lack of affordable housing in the Uckfield area and within the new developments coming forward. Many young people were now being priced out of the market and finding it difficult to stay in the town. The Town Clerk planned to feed these comments back to Wealden District Council for consideration.



Further to last month's article regarding Open Spaces we wish to clarify that the Millennium Green is managed by a charitable trust which is responsible for its ownership and upkeep.
