Grass verge cutting in 2020

At the end of October, members agreed at their Full Council meeting to contribute a sum of £4,271 to East Sussex County Council in 2020 to assist with retaining the six cuts to



urban grass verges in the town of Uckfield. Members contributed in 2019, and as a result of fewer complaints and improved visibility at the roadside, they felt it was important to maintain existing service levels and frequent cuts.

Joining a National Rural/Market Towns Group



Uckfield Town Council has taken up an invitation to join the Rural Services Network Rural/Market Towns Group. Uckfield was one of three market towns in East Sussex selected to represent key service centres in the county, on this national group. The group seeks to encourage Central Government to develop a rural strategy and ensure the voices of rural towns are heard.

Final report from the External Auditor for 2018/19

The External Auditor recently announced their findings for Uckfield Town Council's accounts ending 31st March 2019. No issues were identified and Uckfield Town Council was given a good bill of health - with sound finances and good governance.
