

November is the month for Remembrance.

From Saturday 26 October you will be able to donate to The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. During this period you will see street collectors around the town together with collection boxes in many local businesses and shops.

The Civic Centre, either in the Ashdown Room or the Weald Hall, where you will be able to obtain your poppies and other varied tokens of remembrance.

The Town Council supports the Royal British Legion by contributing towards the costs of the hire of the rooms through the annual grant scheme.

#### Remembrance Sunday

On Remembrance Sunday the town comes together with a parade at 2.30pm from Luxford Field Car Park via the High Street to Holy Cross Church. After the church service there is a two minute silence and wreaths are laid at the war memorial. This is followed by a salute to the Mayor at the library with the parade returning to the car park. Light refreshments will then be available at the Civic Centre.

# OUR BELGIAN HERO BY CLLR DUNCAN BENNETT

101 years ago, an eight year old Belgian boy, Eugene Seghers, was playing among the Flanders Fields, the scene of so much horror over the previous four

years of the Great War.

This "War to end all Wars" sadly turned out to be nothing of the sort and that same boy would grow up to face conflict himself, along with millions of others, in the Second World War.

#### **Invasion of Belgium**

In 1940, Nazi Germany overran Belgium and Eugene Seghers and a number of colleagues from the Belgian Air Force courageously made their way across occupied territory to regroup in Britain and join the Royal Air Force.

Flung straight into the Battle of Britain, Seghers soon built upon his reputation as a talented combat pilot.

By the summer of 1944 he was flying Mk 14 Spitfires and having returned from flying sorties over the beachheads and battlefields of Normandy, his next role was to combat Hitler's new vengeance weapon, the V1 Flying Bomb.

On the 26 July, he targeted a flying bomb heading towards Uckfield. He emptied his cannons, but failed to stop the doodlebug. The bomb's engine then cut out, meaning that it would soon plunge towards the town.

#### Extreme heroism

In an act of extreme heroism, he tried to tip the bomb off course by using the tip of his wing. Tragically, the V1 exploded upon contact, destroying the Spitfire and killing Seghers instantly.

### **Lest We Forget**

Although 75 years have passed, this incredible act of bravery shall not be forgotten in our community. The memorial to Eugene Seghers at The Highlands Inn will be the scene of one of the Acts of Remembrance taking place this coming Remembrance Sunday.

Please do join other members of our community for a simple ceremony and observance of the two-minute silence at 11am.
