ALLOTMENT CONFERENCE UPDATE

Allotment tenants gathered before the Allotment Working Group (AWG) at the annual conference on 10 November 2021. A presentation outlined the review undertaken by the working group over the summer months. They explained the current costs of the Town Council to run the six allotment sites each year which was in the region of £21k. Without taking water rates into account, the Town Council was currently receiving only £4.3k in rental income. This could not continue with increasing costs year on year in



staff resource, materials, fuel etc. The AWG listened to the feedback received from tenants and understood that the proposals (put forward earlier in the year) would have been a shock to tenants, as no substantial changes had been made since 2012. They also understood they could have engaged with tenants better. The AWG presented a revised proposal, which would help to retain the current pricing structure for tenants, and retain concessions thus giving familiarity. But to help cover iust some of the costs UTC incur. an admin fee of £15 would be applied to each plot per annum. This proposal would not come into practice until April 2023 and 12 months notice would be given to tenants on 1 April 2022 for the change in tenancy agreement. No changes would be introduced in the interim period. A letter will be sent out along with a copy of the presentation. and minutes from the meeting to all allotment tenants, with the proposals being presented to Environment and Leisure Committee on 10 January 2022.

Setting our priorities and budget

Despite the lead up to Christmas, work doesn't slow for Town Councillors who have to review a number of detailed draft documents prepared by council staff, for the next financial year (1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023). Members will review the first draft of the strategic priorities and budget at Full Council on 6 December. This timetable is set so the Town Council can inform Wealden District Council (by the end of January) the precept required for 2022/23.

Planning ahead in these uncertain times, makes budget setting particularly difficult. We have to consider increases in utility costs, staffing, building/ grounds materials and food/drink purchases, whilst also considering the potential changes in the way our customers utilise our buildings and open spaces in 2022/23. The pandemic continues to have an impact on our income streams and currently one third of the Town Council's income is generated through its own means; not through your council tax (precept). The draft priorities and budget will be placed on the Town Council's website until Friday 7 January 2022. We would welcome your thoughts on the draft

documents and will then seek to finalise and adopt the strategic plan, the annual budget and annual plan for the Town Council on 17 January 2022.

Christmas Opening Hours

The Civic Centre will close after the last room hire booking on Thursday 23 December and Luxfords Restaurant will close that same day after the Festive Afternoon Tea. Both will then open on Wednesday 29, Thursday 30 and Friday 31 December before reopening on Tuesday 4 January after the new year. Grounds staff will be working on a rota system to ensure litter collections continue over the Christmas break and any urgent matters are addressed. The Town Council offices will close at 5.00pm on Thursday 23 December and reopen on Tuesday 4 January at 9.00am. The main email account (admin@uckfieldtc.gov.uk) will be monitored over the Christmas break should any urgent issues arise.
