The past 12 months have been a challenging time for everyone including the Town Council. As we come to the end of lockdown measures with the vaccine being offered to all by July 31, we look at a snapshot of the last municipal year.

Consultations

We have responded to consultations on:

Uckfield Dementia Forum

Our work with the Uckfield Dementia Forum continued and we have signed up to the Wealden Dementia Action Alliance Dementia Charter, Prior to Christmas, we produced 30 festive dementia-friendly activity packs for those living with dementia and their carers. In addition the Forum was pivotal in the launch of the sunflower lanyard scheme.

Royal British Legion

Once again we were pleased to provide support to the Royal British Legion and Holy Cross Church with preparations for Remembrance Service.



Working with the police

Importantly, we worked closely with Sussex Police to address any reports of crime and anti-social behaviour and encouraged residents to report incidences and provided liaison between key partner agencies.

Shop Safely, Shop Local, Shop Uckfield

We worked with the Wealden District Council. Uckfield Chamber of Commerce. Uckfield FM and local businesses to launch this campaign to promote the excellent facilities and services available in Uckfield.

LOOKING BACK ON LAST YEAR

BY GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE

This year has been like no other, all our meetings have taken place remotely by Zoom. The General Purposes (GP) committee have, in their deliberations, covered a large and wide variety of subjects ranging from property maintenance and improvements, to finance and administrative procedures.

The Covid 19 effect

Throughout the year the committee have been especially mindful of the town council's finances. The effect of Covid 19 has been to reduce very substantially the council's income throughout the lockdown periods and they have considered and implemented ongoing and further methods of reducing expenditure.

Detailed consideration was given to how the 2021/2022 budgets were set together with the awarding of in excess of £49k of grant funding to local groups and organisations within this financial year. The allocation of grant funding for 2021/2022 has also been approved.



The Snatts Road Cemetery building was re-roofed using the existing tiles.



A new air source heat pump system has been installed at Foresters Hall updating the obsolete heating and improving its carbon footprint.

Council buildings

The council's buildings and properties are a very important asset for the town. During the year extensive works have been carried out. These have included replacing the obsolete heating system and renewing decayed flooring at the Foresters Hall; redecorating and replacing lighting with LED and ceiling repairs in the Civic Centre; reroofing at Snatts Road Cemetery and overall general maintenance elsewhere.

Supporting community groups

The committee have supported and been working with groups to improve the community. We are pleased to report that, among others, we have:

- achieved the successful relocation of Wealden Citizens Advice to their new purpose-built facility within the library:
- worked with the Ridgewood Hall committee to bring foward their improvements.

LOOKING BACK ON LAST YEAR

BY ENVIRONMENT AND LEISURE COMMITTEE

This year has brought many challenges and the cancellation or rescheduling of many events. With all of the restrictions in place we have still been able to provide over 30 services during the last year. Below are some of the highlights worth mentioning.

Tree for a tree

In line with the Town Council's 'tree for a tree scheme' and actions around climate change, 277 new trees have been planted this winter. You can see these in Hempstead Meadows and West Park local nature reserves and Hempstead Recreation Ground.

Luxford play area

Following a public consultation and primary school engagement, a brand new play area was installed for Luxford Field which included accessible play equipment and new fencing and pathways. This was opened in September 2020 and has been a very well-used facility by children of all ages and abilities in the centre of the town.

Allotment competition

Staverton's Nursery once again sponsored and judged another fantastic allotment competition which celebrated the excellent work of local people to cultivate good crops and flowers on their allotment sites.



Community speedwatch

A campaign was undertaken to recruit more volunteers to the Community Speedwatch Scheme already in existence in Ridgewood, and investigation into speed indicator devices at the roadside.

BY PLANS COMMITTEE

Uckfield Plans Committee is a 'statutory consultee' and governed by the Local Government Act 1972.

The Committee is made up of seven elected members and is responsible for making representations to the appropriate authorities in response to planning applications in the town, specifically to: -

- consider and respond to all planning applications;
- comment on licensing applications as and when necessary.
- comment on street naming where requested.

 recommend the placing of Tree Preservation Orders where appropriate.

UTC Plans Committee try to represent the views of the town's residents; providing our local knowledge and expertise in relation to matters such as highways, environment, flooding, infrastructure and looking at ways to develop and maintain Uckfield as a thriving and modern town.

The last year has been particularly difficult as we consider the details of numerous large scale/major planning applications on the periphery of Uckfield Town.
