### LAST MONTH IN YOUR COUNCIL

### Priorities and budget for 2023/24

In addition to the festivities, December and January are important months for the Town Council. Councillors prepare the priorities and budget for the next financial year in order to be able to let Wealden District Council know what level of precept is required, by the end of January.

The meeting of full Council on 12 December will see members review the first draft for the financial year 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024. As many businesses are finding, budget setting in these uncertain times is a challenge. We've already seen increases in utility costs, staffing, building/grounds materials and stock in the past 18 months, and it's likely this will continue into 2023. Currently one third of the Town Council's income is generated through its own means; not through your council tax (precept) and we want to ensure we can continue to do this. The documents will be placed on the

23 January 2023.

### **Christmas Opening Hours**

The Civic Centre and Luxford Bestaurant will close after service on Christmas Eve. They will then open on Wednesday 28, Thursday 29 and Friday 30 December before reopening fully on Tuesday 3 January. Grounds staff will be working on a rota system to ensure litter collections continue over the Christmas break and any urgent matters are addressed. The Town Council offices will close at 4.00pm on Friday 23 December and reopen on Tuesday 3 January at 9.00am.
