### What is Antisocial behaviour (ASB)?

As detailed on the Police website it is...

- Personal antisocial behaviour is when a person targets a specific individual or group.
- Nuisance antisocial behaviour is when a person causes trouble, annoyance or suffering to a community.
- Environmental antisocial behaviour is when a person's actions affect the wider environment, such as public spaces or buildings.

### What is Vandalism?

Vandalism is where property is maliciously destroyed or damaged – frequently without theft being involved. The police provide advice on keeping property safe on their website.

## Reporting ASB and Vandalism

Sussex police has a special number to call if you witness any ASB. On weekdays ring 101 or 999 (for emergencies only) and at weekends ring 07770 700642. We have CCTV cameras throughout the town to provide police with extra data and images.

### Recent damage

Damage to personal and public property has occurred recently. Shops and businesses have had to replace the glass in shop front windows including a large window at the Civic Centre which has cost £1,000 to replace. Part of the new play equipment on Luxford Field has



been deliberately damaged by someone trying to burn a plastic unit. This item will cost about £1800 to replace.

Other damaged items include street furniture, defibrillator; the rubbish bins cctv cameras, a blind spot mirror, all repaired or replaced with council tax money that we all pay.

With ASB we've had to change the way we keep the civic centre open in the evenings to consider the welfare and safety of our staff.

All the above doesn't make Uckfield a bad place to live, it just makes things harder for us all. We all love and care for our Town so we must keep reporting things and working with Sussex Police.

# WHO LOOKS AFTER WHAT - UCKFIELD TOWN COUNCIL

Following on from last month's article about what is covered by East Sussex County Council and Wealden District Council we outline below what the town council looks after. Uckfield Town Council has a large asset portfolio and is responsible for managing and overseeing a number of buildings and land within the town. This includes:



- Uckfield's green parks and open spaces
- · Snatts Road Cemetery
- Uckfield play areas, sports pitches and skate park
- · Five allotment sites
- Protection of our nature reserves and conservation areas
- · Ancient woodlands
- · Floral displays and hanging baskets;
- · Christmas lights
- Town Council owned buildings including Civic Centre, Foresters Hall, sport pavilions, and lease agreements with tenants of other key buildings in the town
- · Luxfords Restaurant
- Hire of rooms at the Civic Centre, Foresters Hall and Sport Pavilions
- Events held within the Civic Centre and through the summer on Luxford Field

- Events held within the town to educate, mark special occasions, and celebrate Uckfield.
- · Town Centre CCTV
- Community grants
- · Some street lighting
