ALLOTMENT CONFERENCE UPDATE

The annual allotment conference took place in the Weald Hall, Civic Centre on 20 September 2023 at 7pm and was well supported by allotment holders and residents.

Allotment Competition Winners

Following a short introduction by Town Councillors from the Allotment Working Group and the Environment and Leisure Committee a senior administrative officer presented the allotment competition winners of 2023 for Best Kept Allotment, Ecological Allotment Award, Children's Allotment award, Overall Allotment winner and winner of the Scarecrow Competition.



Added benefits of an allotment

The Chair of the working group read some inspirational words by an allotment holder on the physical and mental health benefits of working an allotment.

Update on fees and protocols

Those present were then updated about the Allotment Working Group discussions and decisions, which included confirmation and an explanation of:-

- · the new admininstrative fees;
- the new protocol for allotment checks by councillors, officers and allotment representatives which would take place three times a year;
- and the benefits to allotment holders joining the Allotment Association to receive not only discounts on seeds and products purchased but also improved communication between tenants and the town council.

Chance to raise questions

A question-and-answer session took place to discuss the fees and charges related to size of allotment plots, grass cutting and waiting lists. In general, feedback from the floor was very positive.
