THE RISE IN PAVEMENT PARKIN

In 2016, Uckfield High Street underwent improvements to provide wider pavements, new trees, street furniture and a resurfaced highway. Sadly over the last two years since the pandemic, it has become noticeable that 'pavement parking' throughout the town and residential areas has increased. Some of the larger vehicles are making business deliveries, but others are shoppers or people collecting and delivering takeaways etc, etc.

Inconvenient and hazardous

Parking on double yellow lines is illegal. Parking on pavements is anti-social. Allowing such parking to go unchecked creates a hindrance to pedestrians particularly those with mobility issues, wheelchairs, scooters, prams, buggies. It is inconvenient and hazardous to other vehicles.





Misuse of on-street parking bays

It is also apparent that some of the vehicles parked in the on-street parking bays, are those working in businesses in the High Street, which then restricts access to these bays for those shopping.

Free car parking

Uckfield is fortunate to have various FREE car parks throughout the town. Continual inconsiderate parking will damage the surface of the pavements (already there are a number of loose kerbstones) and hasten the need for repair - the cost of which will fall on the council tax payer.
