Land at Bird in Eye Farm

A 290-house development south of Bird in Eye Hill, Framfield, TN22 5HA, was dismissed and planning permission refused by the Planning Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. They cited the following grounds: "The harms identified in respect of ancient woodland, highway safety, flood risk, and heritage are individually significant and cumulatively carry substantial weight which is not outweighed by the development proposal." Appeal Ref: APP/C1435/W/22/3307820.

Downlands Farm

An appeal for a 424-house development is being heard by the Planning Inspector and is expected to conclude at the end of November. Decision expected in early 2024. Appeal Ref: WD/2022/1637/MEA.

Mockbeggars Farm

The appeal enquiry for a 60-house development will be heard from 06/02/2024. Appeal Ref: WD/2022/0648/MAO.

Uckfield Town Council have submitted written and verbal reports for all the above planning appeal inquiries and are supporting Wealden District Council in their objection to developments on these sites.

Ridgewood Place

Consultations are currently taking place with Redrow Homes for the reserved matters planning application for Seghers Place, a 750-house development at Ridgewood Place. The planning application for outline planning permission - WD/2015/0209/ MEA Ridgewood Farm - was originally granted in 2016.

SETTING OUR PRIORITIES AND BUDGET FOR 2024-25

We are in the process of setting our priorities and budget for the next financial year, which will run from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025.

The Town Council is required to let Wealden District Council know what precept level is required by mid-January.

Budgeting for 2024-25

Currently, one-third of the Town Council's income is generated through its own means; not through your council tax (precept). We want to ensure we can continue to do this, and explore ways to increase this proportion into the future, whilst finding savings.

It has not been an easy couple of years, with increases in utility costs, staffing, building/grounds materials and stock, and it is likely this will continue in 2024. The meeting of full Council on 11 December will see members review the first draft of the strategic priorities and budget papers for the financial year 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025.

The key documents will then be placed on the Town Council's website until Sunday 7 January 2024 for feedback. We will finalise and adopt the strategic plan, annual budget and annual plan for the Town Council on 15 January 2024.

Christmas Opening Hours

The Civic Centre and Luxford Restaurant will close after service on Saturday 23 December 2023. The Civic Centre and Luxfords Restaurant will then open on Wednesday 27. Thursday 28 and Friday 29 December before fully reopening on Tuesday 2 January 2024. Grounds staff will be working on a rota system to ensure litter collections continue over the Christmas break and any urgent matters are addressed. The Town Council offices will close at 4.00pm on Friday 22 December and reopen on Tuesday 2 January at 9.00am.
