TOWN COUNCIL ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2024

Uckfield Town Council has enjoyed another busy and memorable year in 2024, with many key achievements. From the Civic Centre team that keep things ticking over to our grounds team that manage numerous sites around Uckfield, we've been working hard to deliver value for residents.

As a snapshot of some of the projects we've been working on and the moments that stand out, we look back on our last 12 months.

• January



We began the year with plenty of exciting events, led by the completion of work at The Source.

The demolition of the adjoining building, alongside improvements to The Source and the installation of a car park, saw the site future-proofed for its tenants. The BBC also came to town for Radio 4 show 'Any Questions?', which was broadcast live from a sold-out Weald Hall on a thrilling night for Uckfield.

• February

We were delighted to host the ceremony in which Brighter Uckfield received the King's Award for Voluntary Service from HM Lord-Lieutenant of East Sussex. From humble beginnings, Brighter Uckfield have had an amazing journey to becoming one of 262 groups across the UK who received the prestigious award for 2023/24.



• March

As ever, March marked the time for the Annual Town Meeting.

A productive session saw residents exchange views and Councillors offer progress reports on several projects and the work of each committee.

In addition, Councillors also represented the town at the Wealden Parish Conference, offering important feedback on Wealden District Council's Draft Local Plan.

• April

The new financial year brought fantastic news for several local charities and organisations, as the Town Council announced the 16 Community Grants recipients - and two recipients of service-level agreements - for 2024/25. A busy month also saw upgrades made to the town centre's CCTV Cameras, while the Town Council also financially contributed to ES Highways grass verge cutting programme within the town.

• May



Cllr Karen Bedwell and Cllr Spike Mayhew received the backing of their fellow Councillors to become Town Mayor and Deputy Town Mayor respectively, following the Annual Statutory Meeting on 20 May. They have not looked back since, achieving plenty so far!

• June

On Thursday 6 June, we marked the 80th



anniversary of D-Day with the Beacon Lighting at Victoria Pleasure Ground. With some excellent music, dance, food and drink before the beacon was lit, the event was a fitting commemoration attended by many residents.

• July

In the height of summer, we were successful in obtaining two sets of funding, with a grant to plant community orchards and funding for low-level lighting at the bottom of Luxford Field.

• August

Weald on the Field returned and saw an incredible turnout on a scorching day.



With the music line-up topped by Fat Freddie & The Queens, it was an amazing day packed with top-quality local food, drink, crafts and entertainment. Also, new plumbing and heating systems were installed at Victoria Pavilion, Foresters Hall and Foresters Chapel.

• September

On Wednesday 11 September, we held the annual Allotment Conference. There were presentations, updates and the excitement of award-giving, as the 2024 Allotment Competition winners were announced!

• October



In a month of amazing achievements, the Town Council helped turn Uckfield pink in aid of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and helped celebrate the third birthday of Uckfield Community Fridge.

• November

The Town Council led Remembrance events alongside the Royal British Legion and Holy Cross Church, with three events happening between Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day.

• December

We will finish 2024 by supporting Uckfield Late Night Shopping and organising the town's Christmas lights. With plenty of events - including panto! - still to take place before the year is out, enjoy the festive period and stay tuned for more Town Council news in 2025!

LOOKING AHEAD

Uckfield Town Council is in the process of setting its strategic priorities and budget for the next financial year.

Currently, one-third of the Town Council's income is generated through our own means; not through your council tax (precept). In terms of expenditure, we are seeing an impact from the increases in utility costs, staffing, building/grounds materials, stock and contracts, and this will continue into 2025, which makes for some more detailed discussions during this year's budget setting.

When do plans come into place?

Members will review a first draft of the strategic priorities and budget papers for 1 April 2025 to 31 March 2026 at Full Council on 2 December 2024.

The key documents will then be out for consultation until Wednesday 8 January 2025 and can be accessed via: <https://www.uckfieldtc.gov.uk/community/have-your-say/>

We will finalise and adopt the strategic plan, annual budget and annual plan for the Town Council on 13 January 2025, after which they will be available on our website. We are required to let Wealden District Council know what level of precept is required by mid-January.

CHRISTMAS OPENING HOURS



The Civic Centre and Luxford Restaurant close after Christmas Eve. They both then open on Monday 30 and Tuesday 31 December before reopening on Thursday 2 January 2025. Grounds staff will work on a rota system so litter collections continue over the Christmas break and urgent matters are addressed. The Town Council offices will close at 3:00pm on Christmas Eve and reopen on Thursday 2 January at 9:00am.
